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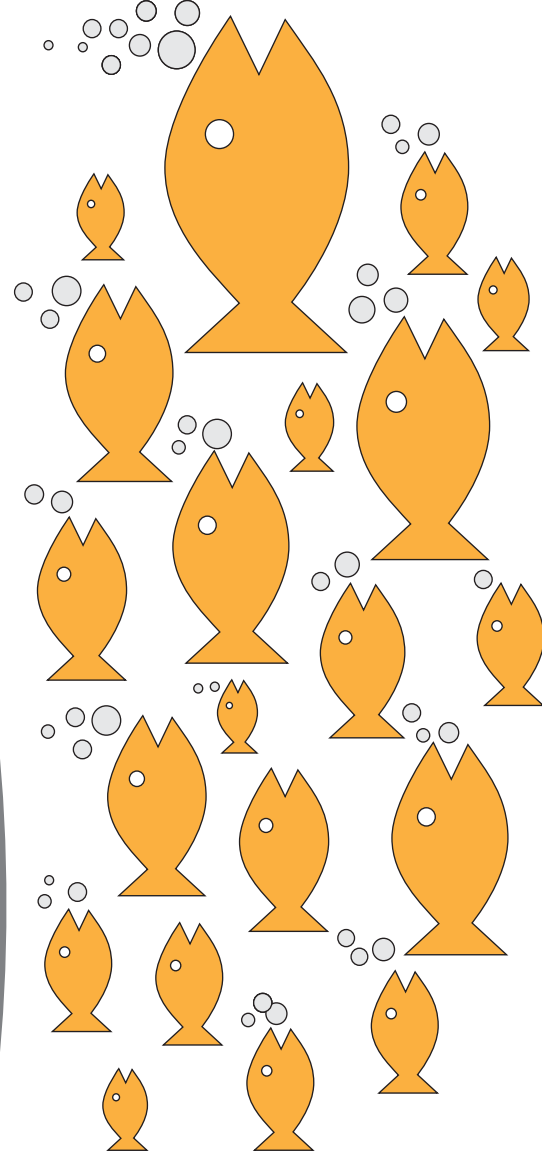
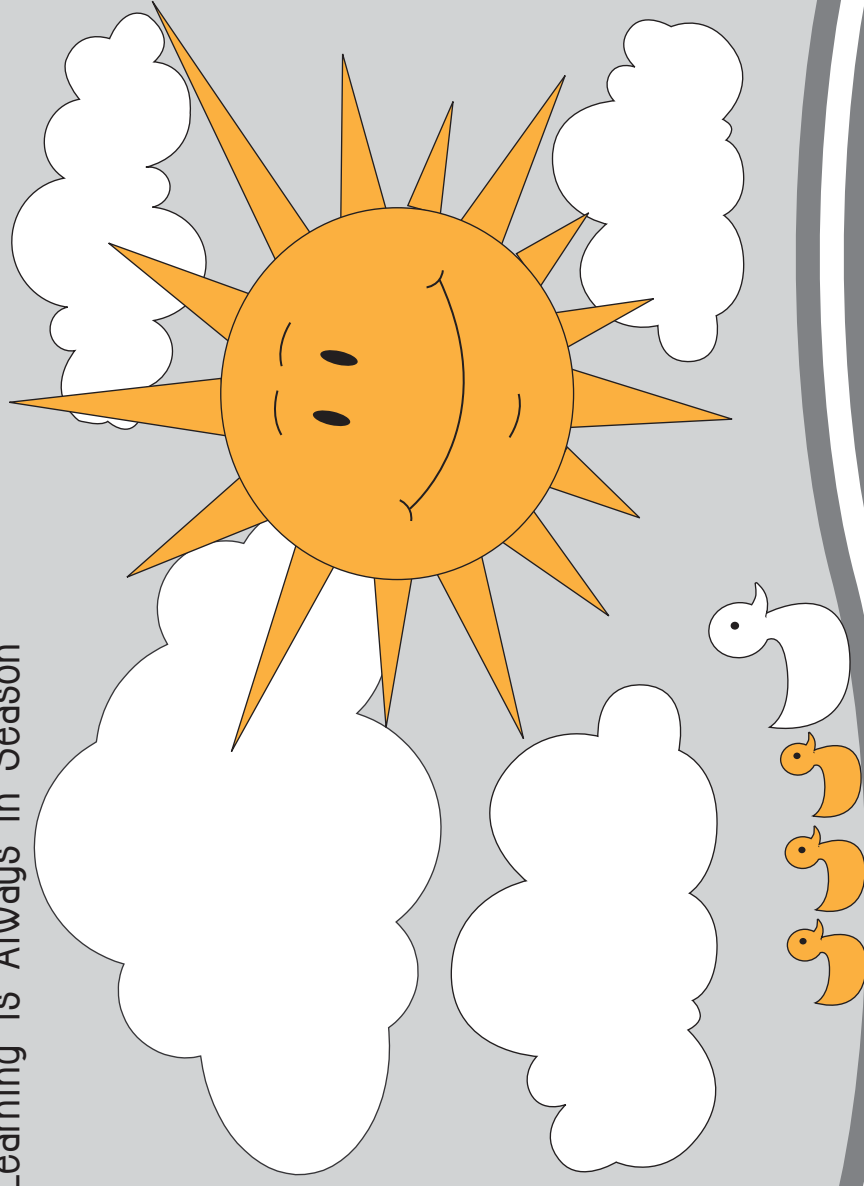

New enrollees (not enrolled in the Childcare Center programs during 2013-2014 school year) will pay a \$25.00 registration fee plus the Activity fee.

Some of the special summer Daycare activities include watching the magical entertainers, visits from the Fire Department, swimming at the Hartland Pool, special projects and many awesome activities!

Activity fee- Busy Bees Classroom (2-3 years old) = \$40.00

Activity fee- Fireflies or Critters Classroom (3-5 year olds) = \$55.00

The Activity fee must be paid in full by June 6.

Your child will need to bring a lunch everyday. If the classroom will be having a "hot lunch", you will be notified ahead of time. Before and After school child care is held at the Hartland Community Education Childcare Center. We offer care for children who attend the Round, Village and Creekside, Lakes Elementary and Farms Intermediate school. The children who attend the Lakes or Farms schools may enroll at the School Street center, or take advantage of the school-age program at the Lakes school. The School street location and Lakes school center are open at 6:30 a.m. Each center closes at 6:00 p.m.

Both programs offer gym activities, arts and crafts, and outside play. When you are signed up for the Before and After school care, you also have the option of attending on the "No School" days or Snow days! Our center is almost always open!

Before & After School Rates

Full Time enrollment (5 days a week) is \$8.00 a session or \$40.00 for the week.

Part Time enrollment (2-4 days a week) is \$10.00 a session.

The Before School (AM) and After School (PM) are each individual sessions.

Part Time schedules must be established in writing. (Ex.) If your child needs 4 days of AM care and 2 days of PM care. The total tuition due is \$60.00 for the week.

Your set weekly tuition will be charged unless the Center is closed. If you attend on an extra day (No School. Change of schedule, Etc.), there will be an additional charge added. Please refer to the "Dates of Importance."

Please note: Farms Intermediate and Lakes students may enroll at Hartland Childcare Center, if you have a sibling that attends the Center or you need child care before 7 a.m.

PRESCHOOL 2014-2015

Hartland Community Education Preschool offers an exceptional educational program staffed with individuals who are qualified and eager to offer your child the finest start into their educational future. Our teaching teams of DeRosier/ Waldron, Lubeski/ Messner, and Pederson/Yoerg have a combined experience of more than 50 years of teaching excellence within the Hartland community.

Our tuition-based program is designed to develop social and educational skills through play-based activities as well as encourage your child to develop a positive self-image through social interaction and problem solving and offer a wide range of activities to accommodate the varied stages of your child's development.

As your child progresses through the program, they will work on strengthening their fine and gross motor skills and progress through introductory reading, math and science as part of the curriculum throughout the year.

The Hartland Community Education Preschool program offers two convenient locations: The Hartland Childcare Center located on School Street in the Village of Hartland and the Hartland Educational Support Service Center (H.E.S.S.C.) located on Highland Road (M-59.)

All of our classrooms are equipped with state-of-the-art SMART Board technology to help tie in our center with Hartland School's curriculum and approach to early elementary education.

Children should be developmentally prepared and independently toilet trained.

To be eligible for our 3 year old preschool program this year, your child must be 3 before October 15, 2014. To be eligible for our 4 year old preschool program this year, your child must be 4 before December 1, 2014.

CLASS OFFERINGS

Pederson/Yoerg: From our fun-filled science discovery room to weekly Spanish lessons, our extended day program, which runs from 9 am- 1 pm, is designed to fill your child's day with fun and enriching programs. Providing the laughter as well as the education, Hartland extended-day co- teachers Tara Yoerg and Sue Pederson are experienced and committed to your young child's development while instilling a love for learning, education and school.

DeRosier/Waldron: With more than 15 years of teaching experience in Hartland, the team of DeRosier/Waldron offers morning 3 year old and afternoon 4 year old classes located at the Childcare Center. By incorporating new technology into all of our preschool classrooms, such as SMART boards for letter writing and sounds, counting, shapes and music to traditional learning settings such as rug time, Hartland preschool will help prepare your child for their transition into Kindergarten.

Lubeski/Messner: Located at the HESSC building, the team of Lubeski/Messner offer a 3-year-old, 4-year-old and a split-class option of 3-and 4-year old classes to accommodate each child's ability and learning level. Entering their eighth year of team teaching together, Lubeski and Messner provide an experienced classroom learning setting with a consistently warm and welcoming atmosphere.

The Hartland Preschool teaching teams also offer an additional Friday class option with families having the ability to choose either a Monday/ Wednesday or Tuesday/ Thursday schedule with an additional Friday option and a flexible afternoon scheduling. We also offer two classes that include a 3-year old and 4-year-old split.

Start of the Year Information

Parents of all registered children will be emailed a registration packet in mid-August. The packet contains forms and information regarding Preschool orientation. We are hosting a parent meeting on Wednesday, September 3 at 7 pm to allow parents the opportunity to meet their child's teacher, hear from the district's curriculum director and have an opportunity to attend a break-out session with individual teachers.

We hold two parent-teacher conferences during the school year to discuss your child's progress and allow for two-way communication regarding your child's development. We will offer our opinion on your child's readiness for kindergarten.

TUITION and PAYMENT PLANS

Tuition for the entire year varies depending on your choice of payment plans and whether you attend two, three, four or five days per week. Tuition that is paid in full, on or before the first day of preschool will be given a 5% discount. Refunds will be processed only when children move from this area or if all avenues to serve the needs of the child have been explored.

A registration fee of \$50 is due at registration (\$25 is refundable upon your notification of cancellation by June 30, 2014) Registration fee is not applicable towards the tuition amount due.

Several convenient payment plans (pay in full with 5% discount, eight (8) payments and our popular three (3) payment option) are offered. Eight (8) and three (3) payment options require the use of a credit or debit card with an authorization form on file. 2014 Virtual Summer School Classes

For the student looking to get ahead and open up their schedule next year AND for the student that needs to get credit in a class they have already attempted and/or improve their GPA

Hartland's Online Summer School classes are offered by Michigan Virtual School, a non-profit organization offering more than 200 online courses and six different foreign languages. These are high school level classes and meet the Michigan Merit Curriculum Standards. All classes are taught by a Michigan certified on-line teacher. You must have reliable access to the internet. Please visit the website for a complete listing of courses. www.mivhs.org Help Desk (888) 889-2840. Seven days a week. If you have already attempted the class for credit and failed for whatever reason, you may be able to take a remedial class for credit using APEX. If you are NOT from the Hartland Consolidated School District please consult with your counselor prior to registering to make sure the credit is accepted.

The cost of Michigan Virtual Summer School is \$275 for the first class and \$250 for an additional class for the same person. We do offer a payment plan by credit card for an additional cost. The cost for APEX is \$99 per class.

Grades: Final letter grades will be emailed to the student and parent by Hartland Community Education around August 25th. Your home school will also be sent notification of your final grade.

The Community Education Office (HCEC) is located at 9525 Highland Rd (M-59) in the Hartland Educational Support Service Center (former high school), 810.626.2150.

Fees must be paid upon registration. A \$25 fee will be assessed for returned checks. Some courses may require additional fees for materials and supplies. The materials fee, when applicable, is payable to the instructor at the first session

A FULL REFUND will be made if a class or program is cancelled because of insufficient enrollment. Refunds for cash/checks will be processed within 10 business days. If you cancel and request a refund please read carefully:

A refund will be issued on classes five sessions or longer (minus \$10 processing fee per class or program) if the participant cancels within two business days after attending the first class. This allows us time to place someone from the waiting list.

Hartland LEGACY Alternative Education

"Working to develop a community of learners who are prepared to live, work and contribute to an ever-changing society and world."

What is LEGACY? As LEGACY celebrated its 30th anniversary, its role in educating Hartland youth is changing. However, the program's primary focus, demonstrated by its acronym Let's Educate, Graduate and Care for our Youth, remains.

LEGACY offers students an alternative method to earn their high school diploma. Class sizes are small, with a 20 to 1 student/teacher ratio. Teachers are able to meet individual academic needs. In addition to academics, LEGACY provides instruction in support of other key areas including: healthy choices, parenting, substance abuse awareness and career planning. The program boasts on-site counseling, group support, academic tutoring and planning for successful futures.

Who attends LEGACY? Students who attend LEGACY care about their education. They work hard at academics and choose to get involved in their school community and community-at-large. Some of the students are looking for a second chance or a different way to learn.

When are classes? Classes follow a traditional school calendar. Students attend on a daily, reduced-hour schedule. Time away from the classroom allows for greater involvement in career planning, work experience and community volunteerism. Correspondence classes provide non-traditional course options. Student responsibility initiatives are also part of the credit-earning process.

Hartland Virtual Academy

In its second year, HVA has over 50 students on a seat time waivers.

Who should consider virtual learning? Seat time waivers are designed for students who are interested in working on their high school graduation requirements on-line. The completion of an individualized seat time waiver educational plan will earn students a high school diploma.

Why take advantage of this opportunity? Completing high school through a seat time waiver program affords high school students the opportunity to adjust their optimal learning times around other factors that can distract them from being successful in the traditional learning environment. Students are assigned an adult mentor to help them focus on the established learning outcomes. Plus, the curriculum covers State of Michigan high school standards designed to prepare students for college or a career upon graduation. Also, students may be able to enroll in partial seat time waiver and regular high school classes at the same time.

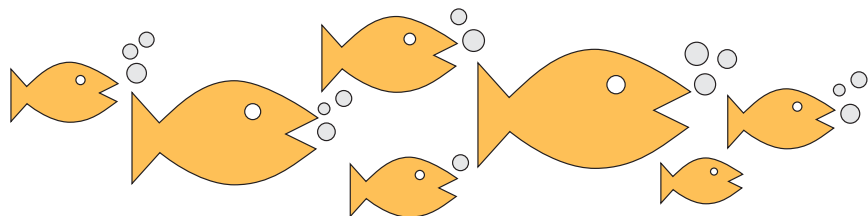

Safe Town 2014

Program is held at Village Elementary in the Cafeteria and Outside!

Safe Town is an early childhood safety education program. Safe Town is for children entering Kindergarten or First Grade in the fall of 2014. Children learn all aspects of safety through projects, songs, games, presentations and plays.

Part of each day is spent "In the Town" with some of the children being pedestrians and some as drivers (of 14" or 16" two wheel bikes with training wheels). PLEASE HAVE YOUR CHILD BRING IN THEIR HELMET WITH THEIR NAME ON IT.

This program teaches bus safety, electricity and water safety, dog safety, stranger safety, bike safety and much more. Visitors come each day. Crafts supporting the daily theme are completed and children get important information about starting school.

The sessions meet for one week for 4 hours per day. Children are required to bring their own lunch with a beverage each day.

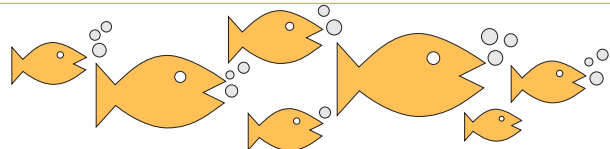

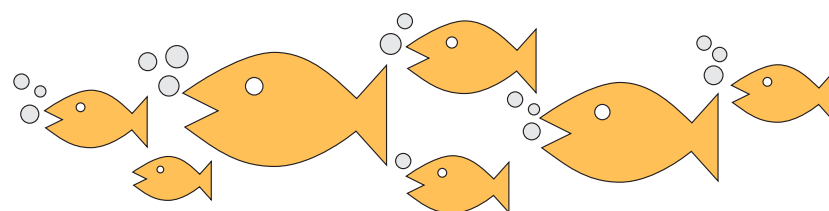
